(a) and (b) Ministry of Culture through Sangeet Natak Akademi (SNA), the nodal implementing agency for Intangible Cultural Heritage (ICH), examines the proposal(s) received from the community/ stakeholders for inclusion/ nomination to the UNESCO'S Representative List of ICH of Humanity.

For inclusion of an element in the UNESCO's Representative List of ICH, the state parties are required to submit nomination dossier on the relevant element for evaluation and examination by UNESCO Committee.

No proposal in prescribed format has been received.
