- (a) the most significant milestones achieved under the Smart Cities Mission (SCM) since its inception;
- (b) the manner in which the mission has improved urban infrastructure, such as roads, water supply, and waste management;
- (c) whether the SCM was successfully completed; and

## STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY OF PARTS (a) to (d) OF THE RAJYA SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 74 FOR ANSWER ON 10.02.2025 REGARDING SMART CITIES MISSION ACHIEVEMENTS

(a) to (d) Smart Cities Mission (SCM) was launched on 25.06.2015 with the aim to promote cities by providing core infrastructure and give a decent quality of life to its citizens through application of 'Smart' Solutions. The implementation of SCM at the City level has been done by a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV). The mission followed an area-based development approach through retrofitting, redevelopment and greenfield development in 100 cities. This approach accounted for other projects in the selected area, from multiple funding sources like convergence with other Central and State Government schemes, Public Private Partnership etc.

100 cities have undertaken a total of 8,058 projects amounting to ₹1,64,368 crore, in the mission. As on 20.01.2025, 7,480 projects (i.e. 93% of total projects) amounting to ₹1,50,017 crore have been completed, as per the data provided by 100 Smart Cities. Details of significant milestones achieved under various core infrastructure sectors of SCM is at Annexure.

Under SCM, the Central Government has a total outlay of ₹48,000 crore for the 100 cities. As on 20.01.2025, the cities have been able to claim central financial assistance of ₹47,425 crore (i.e. 98.8% of the total Central share allocation) as per the utilization of funds provided by them. The States/Union Territories are reported to have utilized ₹45,506 crore (i.e. 96% of the total Central share released).
