#### STATUS OF STAR RATINGS SCHEME OF MINES

#### 118 SHRI KARTIKEYA SHARMA:

Will the Minister of MINES be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of mines in the country that have received star ratings since the announcement of the Scheme, if so, the details thereof, State-wise;
- (b) the number of mineral explorations that have been done during the last five years in Haryana, if so, the project-wise details thereof; and
- (c) the steps that are being taken by Government to promote eco-sensitive mining particularly in Haryana, if so, the details thereof?

### **ANSWER**

# THE MINISTER OF COAL AND MINES (SHRI G. KISHAN REDDY)

- (a) The felicitation of five star rated mines was first started on a pilot basis for the year 2014-15 in the National Conclave on Mines and Minerals (NCMM) held on 4-5 July 2016. Indian Bureau of Mines launched Star Rating of Mines in August 2016 as an effective implementation tool of the Sustainable Development framework. The details of number of mines in the country that have received Star Rating year wise and state wise since inception in 2014-15 is given at Annexure I.
- (b) During last 5 field seasons i.e. from FS: 2020-21 to 2024-25, GSI has taken up 6 mineral exploration programmes on REE- RM, basemetals, tin, tungsten, copper in different parts of Haryana (Annexure-II).
- (c) The Government of India has given specific emphasis on sustainable development and eco-sensitive mining in the entire Country in the National Mineral Policy, 2019. To ensure implementation of Sustainable Mining, provision have been notified under Chapter-V of MCDR, 2017, wherein Rule 35 to 44 cover major aspects of Sustainable Mining. It is mandatory for the mine operators to maintain at least three star rating in their leases on year-to-year basis. The Star Ratings is being awarded, based on evaluation of performance of mines on technological, socio-economic and environmental parameters based on objective reporting of their activities. An online system has been designed with an objective to bring in transparency as well ease of doing business.
