AVAILABILITY OF SANITATION FACILITIES FOR HOUSEHOLDS IN RURAL AREAS OF TAMIL NADU

1203. DR. KANIMOZHI NVN SOMU:

Will the Minister of **JAL SHAKTI** be pleased to state:

(a) the current status of implementation of Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) in the State of Tamil Nadu including the coverage and extent of availability of sanitation facilities for households in rural areas, district-wise;

(b) the details of the funds allocated under SBM to the State;

(c) the unspent funds out of the funds allocated to the State during the last five years;

(d) the details of women in rural areas of the State who do not have access to the sanitation facilities which seriously affect their hygiene; and

(e) the action taken for the redressal of this problem?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR JAL SHAKTI (SHRI V. SOMANNA)

(a) Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen) [SBM(G)] was launched on 2nd October, 2014 with the goal to make the rural areas of the country Open Defecation Free (ODF) by 2nd October, 2019, the 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, by providing access to toilets to all the rural households. More than 54 lakh Individual Household Latrines (IHHLs) were constructed under the programme and, as a result, all the villages of Tamil Nadu had declared themselves ODF by 2nd October, 2019. The State was however advised to ensure that any leftout household was also covered under the programme to construct IHHL by entering details of such households in the online Integrated Management Information System (IMIS) of SBM(G). Phase II of Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen) [SBM(G)] is being implemented during the period from 2020-21 to 2025-26, with the focus on Open Defecation Free (ODF) sustainability and to cover all the villages with solid and liquid waste management i.e. converting the villages from ODF to ODF Plus (Model). Under Phase-II of SBM(G), more than 4.48 lakh IHHLs have been constructed in

Tamil Nadu. 11,341 villages have declared themselves Open Defecation Free (ODF) Plus (Aspiring-2,063, Rising-424 and Model-8854) upto 5-3-2025 in the Tamil Nadu. Also 11,413 villages have been covered with Solid Waste Management (SWM) and 9,491 villages covered with Grey Water Management (GWM) upto 5-3-2025 in the Tamil Nadu.

District-wise, Total households and households with toilets in Tamil Nadu as per Integrated Management Information System (IMIS) of SBM(G) as on 5.3.2025 are at Annexure-1.
