- (c) the manner in which Government is trying to encourage entrepreneurs to set-up tea and golf tourism centers in North East and Assam?

(a) to (c): Development and promotion of tourist destinations and products, including tea and golf tourism is undertaken by the respective State Government/Union Territory (UT) Administration. The Ministry complements the efforts of States/UTs by developing and promoting various tourism products of the country, including tea and golf tourism through various schemes and initiatives.

The Ministry of Tourism through its central sector schemes of 'Swadesh Darshan (SD)', 'Pilgrimage Rejuvenation and Spiritual, Heritage Augmentation Drive (PRASHAD)' and 'Assistance to Central Agencies for Tourism Infrastructure Development' complements the efforts of tourism infrastructure development in the country by extending financial assistance to the State Governments/UT Administrations. The details of projects sanctioned in Assam under these schemes and the various initiatives undertaken to promote tea and golf tourism are given in Annexure.
