(SMT. ANUPRIYA PATEL)

(a) : The Special Campaign 4.0 was conducted by the Department of Fertilizers with an aim to achieve the goals of institutionalizing Swachhata and reducing pendency in Government offices as per the Guidelines issued by the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances (DARPG) dated 22.08.2024. Under the Special Campaign 4.0, the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samridhhi Kendras (PMKSKs) were identified as the Cleanliness sites with an aim to improve the PMKSKs with clean premises, enhanced facilities and easy accessibility for farmers.

(b) to (c): The availability of fertilizers in the country, including the State of Haryana, has remained adequate during the ongoing Rabi 2024-25 season and the details of the requirement, availability, sales and closing stock of fertilizers i.e. Urea, DAP, MOP and NPKS are given at **Annexure**.
