**CERVICAL CANCER AWARENESS AND TREATMENT GOALS**

**2048. SHRI GOLLA BABURAO:**

Will the **MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government has set focused goals and aims to combat the threat of cervical cancer in women;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, including data on the affected demography, State-wise and age-wise; and
- (c) the details of awareness sessions, workshops, research initiatives and other programmes spearheaded by Government to mitigate, treat and assist cases of cervical cancer?

**ANSWER**

(a) to (c): The Department of Health and Family Welfare provides technical and financial support to States and Union Territories under the National Programme for Prevention and Control of Non-Communicable Diseases (NP-NCD) as part of the National Health Mission (NHM). The programme focuses on strengthening infrastructure, human resource development, early diagnosis, referral, treatment, and health promotion for Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) including cervical cancer. Under the programme, 770 District NCD Clinics, 372 District Day Care Centres, and 6410 NCD Clinics at Community Health Centres have been set up.

The Central Government implements the Strengthening of Tertiary Care Cancer Facilities Scheme, under which 19 State Cancer Institutes (SCIs) and 20 Tertiary Care Cancer Centres (TCCCs) have been set up. The National Cancer Institute at Jhajjar (Haryana) and the second campus of Chittaranjan National Cancer Institute, Kolkata provide advanced diagnostic and treatment facilities. Cancer treatment facilities have also been approved in all 22 new AIIMS. Treatment in Government Hospitals is free or highly subsidized for the poor.

As per the ICMR National Cancer Registry Programme (NCRP), the estimated number of cervical cancer cases by States/UTs during 2019-2023 is provided in the Annexure.

Prevention, control, and screening services are provided through trained frontline workers (ASHA & ANM), with referral support through healthcare institutions for individuals aged 30 years and above. High-risk individuals are referred for screening.

Public awareness initiatives include observance of National Cancer Awareness Day, World Cancer Day, and financial support under NHM for awareness generation. National Workshop on Non-Communicable Diseases was organized on 8th-9th January 2025 in Hyderabad toward achieving the government's vision of a "Healthy India", with an emphasis on universal access to quality healthcare services and the reduction of premature mortality from NCDs.

Further, Eat Right Initiative by FSSAI promotes safe and healthy food. The Fit India and Khelo India programmes by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports encourage physical fitness and health.
