**(c) whether the number of cases were increased, if so, whether increased number of cases indicates better surveillance or is it a negative factor indicating increase in drug usage?**

**(a) to (c) Number of cases registered by Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) during last three years, year-wise and State-wise details is at Annexure-I.**

**Year-wise and State-wise data of conviction of cases of Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) for last three years is at Annexure-II. The Government of India is taking concrete and determined steps to eradicate drug trafficking menace in the country. Towards this goal, the Government is strengthening its anti-narcotic agencies including Narcotics Control Bureau. In recent**

**years, there is a focus on inter-agency cooperation and information sharing, leading to more effective detection and seizures. Government has also constituted a 4-tier Narco-Coordination Centre (NCORD) mechanism for ensuring better coordination between Central & State Drug Law Enforcement Agencies and other stakeholders in the field of controlling drug trafficking and drug abuse. An all-in-one NCORD portal, “One Stop Solution” has been developed for information related to drug law enforcement. To monitor the investigation of important and significant seizures, a Joint Coordination Committee (JCC) under the Chairmanship of Director General, Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) has been set up by Government of India.**
