2756 DR. VIKRAMJIT SINGH SAHNEY:

Will the Minister of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution be pleased to state:

- the details of the total number of Fair Price Shops and Jan Poshan Kendras in the (a) country, State-wise and district-wise for Punjab;
- whether Government is planning to add millets in the Public Distribution System in place of rice and wheat for better nutritional food for the public; and
- (c) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR MINISTRY OF CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD & PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION (SHRIMATI NIMUBEN JAYANTIBHAI BAMBHANIYA)

The total number of Fair Price Shops (FPSs) under NFSA are 5,43,259 across the country and the statement indicating the State-wise total number of FPSs is at Annexure-A. Further, the details of district-wise FPSs (operational) in Punjab are at Annexure-B.

Moreover, a study to transform a total 60 FPSs, i.e., 15 FPSs each from States/districts, into Jan Poshan Kendras (JPK), namely, Gujarat (Ahmedabad), Telangana (Hyderabad), Rajasthan (Jaipur) and Uttar Pradesh (Ghaziabad) has been initiated.

(b) and (c): Under Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY), foodgrains are being provided to States/UTs for distribution to around 80 crore beneficiaries through Targeted Public Distribution System (TPDS), free of cost from 1st January 2023. The term 'foodgrains' is defined as rice, wheat & coarse grains (including millets) or any combination thereof conforming to such quality norms as may be determined, by order, by the Central Government from time to time. In addition to this, the State/UT Governments may formulate food or nutrition based plans or schemes providing for benefits higher than the benefits provided under PMGKAY.

Coarse grains/ Millets are also allocated under PDS in lieu of equal quantity of wheat/rice (as requested by the State) while ensuring that the overall quantity of rice, wheat and coarse grains has to be within the upper ceiling fixed in respect of each State/UT.
