2981. SMT. SAGARIKA GHOSE:

Will the **Minister of Road Transport and Highways** be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of kilometres length of road network in the country that have been selected for white-topping;
- (b) whether this method of construction will be applied in the State of West Bengal;
- (c) if so, the details thereof and, if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (d) the detrimental effect of white-topping on the environment?

- (a) to (c) Length of National Highways (NHs) selected for white-topping in the States/Union Territory (UTs) is annexed. The extant policy of the government regarding selection of white-topping technology is applicable for any NH-section of the country including NHs in the state of West Bengal, wherever required.
- (d) A few effects of white-topping on the environment are reduction in urban heat island effect, better reflection of lights from vehicles enhances safety, better visibility, lowers energy requirement of external lighting, lower contribution to heat in the environment, etc.
