Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government plans to implement a structured and time-bound compensation framework for communities affected by human-elephant conflicts in Nagaland;
- (b) the steps being taken to integrate bamboo cultivation into the Nagaland Forest Management Project (NFMP) as recommended by the Union Minister during his visit; and
- (c) whether there are any plans to expand externally aided projects such as the Forest and Biodiversity Management in the Himalaya (KFW Project) and the NFMP to other regions facing similar environmental challenges?

(a) In addition to compensation schemes of the State Governments/UTs Administration, the Ministry is also providing financial assistance to States/UTs under Centrally Sponsored Scheme, Project Tiger & Elephant, for ex-gratia relief, depending upon availability of funds, at the following rates;
