MEETING WITH SRI LANKAN MINISTER TO BOOST FARM PRODUCTIVITY

3102. SHRI SHAKTISINH GOHIL:

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:-

- (a) whether the Indian High Commissioner met with Sri Lankan Agriculture Minister to discuss bilateral opportunities in boosting farm productivity;
- (b) the steps being taken to modernise farm productivity, incomes for farmers and technological transfers; and
- (c) the role “Neighbourhood First Policy” plays in shaping India’s agricultural co-operation with Sri Lanka and how this policy aligns with its goals of enhancing food security and agricultural development?

ANSWER

(a) to (c) The High Commissioner of India to Sri Lanka met Hon’ble K. D. Lalkantha, Minister of Agriculture, Livestock, Land and Irrigation of Sri Lanka on 24 February 2025 in Colombo to discuss opportunities for bilateral cooperation in the agricultural sector.

During the State Visit of President Anura Kumara Disanayaka to India in December 2024, both sides agreed to establish a Joint Working Group (JWG) to examine possibilities for the comprehensive development of the agricultural sector in Sri Lanka.

As part of the ‘Neighbourhood First’ policy, India has consistently responded to the food security and agricultural development requirements of Sri Lanka. In response to the urgent request of Sri Lanka during the economic crisis (2022) to secure urea fertilizer, Government of India provided expeditious assistance of USD 55 million under Line of Credit to Sri Lanka for procurement of urea. India has also extended grant assistance of LKR 300 million (approx. INR 12 Crore) for construction of first-of-its-kind 5000 MT temperature controlled warehouse for perishable agricultural produce in Dambulla, in the Central Province of Sri Lanka.
