(a) to (d): The Government had constituted a High Level Committee under the Chairmanship of Shri Ram Nath Kovind, former President of India, to examine the modalities of conduct of Simultaneous Elections. The Committee held extensive consultations with the stakeholders and submitted its Report. As per the Report 47 Political Parties provided feedback, with 32 agreeing and 15 indicating disagreement with simultaneous elections. The Report also states that the website feedback analysis on simultaneous elections garnered 5,232 responses wherein 3,837 supported the idea, while 1,395 opposed it. With respect to the responses received through Post, the Report mentions that 154 postal responses were received of which 109 favoured the idea and 45 opposed it. The Report further states that 16,172 responses were received through e-mails wherein 83% (13,396) responses were in favor of simultaneous elections whereas 17% (2,776) were against simultaneous elections.
