#### 3329 SHRI RWNGWRA NARZARY:

Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the positive impact of DeendayalUpadhyayaGrameenKaushalYojna under NRLM;
- (b) the outcome of providing placement-linked skill training to poor households in rural area;
- (c) whether the scheme has been able to achieve its guaranteed placement to trained candidates;
- (d) if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) if not, the reasons therefor?

### **ANSWER**

# MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI KAMLESH PASWAN)

(a) to (d): DeenDayalUpadhyay-GrameenKaushalYojana (DDU-GKY) is an ongoing scheme being implemented in the country under National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM). It is a placement-linked market driven skill development program for rural poor youth in the age group of 15-35 years. It empowers the rural poor youth with employable skills and facilitates their participation in regular labour markets, thus providing them with jobs having regular monthly wages at or above the minimum wages.

The positive impact of DDU-GKY Programme is made through training and placement of rural poor youth. The year-wise details of number of candidates trained and placed under DDU-GKY since inception is given as below:
