GLITCHES IN THE E-CHALLAN WEB PAGE OF DELHI POLICE

Will the Minister of Home Affairs be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Delhi Police webpage for online payment of traffic challan is riddled with glitches;

(b) the reasons that despite paying challan online, the status of payment is not updated and hence people end up paying the same challan multiple times and whether there is also no provision on the portal to know the details of multiple payments made;

(c) whether the procedure for refund of excess payment made is complex and confusing; and

(d) whether Government proposes to rectify the above glitches in the webpage, if so, the details thereof?

(a): As per the inputs received from Delhi Police, currently there are no

issues with the online payment module on the Delhi Traffic Police website.

The webpage to settle the challan online is hosted on the official website of

the Delhi Traffic Police. In the event of any technical glitch, such issues are

promptly reported to the technical team for check and resolution at the

earliest.

(b) to (d): Payments made on the Delhi Traffic Police website are reflected in real-time, and challans are successfully updated. Individuals can verify their payment by visiting the URL: <u>https//traffic.delhipolice.gov.in/</u> <u>notice/check-payment.</u> This webpage also provides information of the number of attempts made for the payment of a particular challan. Additionally, individuals can confirm the payment status of a paid challan and generate the payment slip. Enhancing the functionality and interface of a website is a continuous process and Delhi Police keeps on updating its website, from time to time, to provide a more user-friendly service to individuals.
