MEDICAL SERVICES AT RAILWAY STATIONS AND TRAINS

3953 SHRI RYAGA KRISHNAIAH:

Will the Minister of Railways be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government has conducted any study/survey regarding establishment of medical emergency centres at all railway stations and passenger trains across the country over the last five years;
- (b) if so, details regarding steps undertaken to set up medical assistance/emergency centres at railway stations and passenger trains, State-wise and district-wise for Andhra Pradesh;
- (c) total number of front line staff employed in railways and number of people trained to render first aid service, State-wise and district-wise for Andhra Pradesh; and
- (d) total number of railway stations provided with railway ambulances, State-wise and district-wise in Andhra Pradesh?

ANSWER

(a) to (d): The need and extent of providing medical facilities at railway stations and in trains was examined by Hon'ble Supreme Court.

In compliance of the orders, a committee of experts was constituted at All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), New Delhi. As recommended by Committee of experts, instructions have been issued to provide a Medical Box containing life saving medicines, equipments, oxygen cylinder etc. at all Railway stations and passenger carrying trains.

Front line staff i.e. Train Ticket Examiner, Train Guards/Superintendents, Station Master etc. are trained in rendering First Aid. Regular refresher courses are conducted for such staff. List of nearby hospitals and doctors along with their contact numbers is available at all Railway Stations.

Ambulance services of Railways, State Government/Private Hospitals and ambulance service providers are utilized to transport the injured/sick passengers to the hospitals/doctor's clinics.
