RISING FISCAL DEFICIT

Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Fiscal Deficit in India is increasing on a yearly basis;
- (b) if so, the details thereof for the last three years, year-wise;
- (c) whether Government has found out the reasons for this continuous rise;
- (d) if so, the steps taken by Government to reverse this trend;
- (e) whether it has an impact on the lives of the common people; and
- (f) if so, the steps taken by Government to insulate common people?

(a) and (b) No Sir. The fiscal deficit, as percentage of GDP, has been on a downward trend since FY 2020-21 (table below):
