**HEALTHCARE INFRASTRUCTURE IN RURAL AREAS OF THE COUNTRY**

Will the **Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of health schemes implemented by Government during the last three years to improve the health infrastructure in rural areas of the country;
- (b) the details of health schemes implemented during the said period, State-wise, particularly in the State of Rajasthan; and
- (c) whether any special scheme has been operated by Government during the said period for health improvement in the State of Rajasthan, if so, the details of funds expended for the implementation of the said scheme in the State, year-wise?

(a) to (c): The primary responsibility of strengthening public healthcare system lies with the respective State/UT Governments. The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare provides technical and financial support to the States/UTs including Rajasthan to strengthen the public healthcare system in rural areas based on the proposals received in the form of Programme Implementation Plans (PIPs) under National Health Mission. Government of India provides approval for the proposal in the form of Record of Proceedings (RoPs) as per norms & available resources. The details are available in public domain at:

Details of funds approved during the current FY 2025-26 & for the last three FYs i.e 2024-25; 2023-24; 2022-23 for development of building infrastructure under NHM to the State of Rajasthan are as under:

In addition to the National Health Mission, Government of India is implementing the following schemes in States/UTs including Rajasthan to improve the healthcare infrastructure and service delivery in backward and under-served regions:

**PM Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM-ABHIM)** PM Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM-ABHIM) envisages increased investments in public health and other health reforms to provide better access to health in rural areas. Administrative approvals have been accorded to the State of Rajasthan for five years (i.e. FY 2021-22 to 2025-2026) for an amount of Rs. 2618.97 Cr. for construction/ strengthening of 1112 Building less SHCs, 639 Urban-AAM, 184 Block Public Health Units, 33 IPHLs at District level and 33 CCBs at District Hospitals and Medical college level.

- Under **Fifteenth Finance Commission (FC-XV)** for the State of Rajasthan, Rs.4305.27 Crore has been approved for the five year period from FY 2021-22 to FY 2025-26 and Rs.1606.55 Cr. has been released so far that also includes capital cost for establishment and strengthening of 2741 Building less SHCs, 564 Building less PHCs, 38 Building less CHCs, 168 Block Public Health Units, and 284 Urban- AAMs.

- The **Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY)** aims at correcting regional imbalances in the availability of affordable tertiary healthcare services and to augment facilities for quality medical education in the country. Under the Scheme, approvals has been accorded for setting up of an AIIMS at Jodhpur and upgradation of four Government Medical Colleges/ Institutions (GMCIs) at Bikaner, Udaipur, Kota and Jaipur for the State of Rajasthan.

- Under Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) for '**Establishment of new medical colleges attached with existing district/referral hospitals**' Establishment of 157 medical colleges have been approved in three Phases of the Scheme, out of which 40 are in aspirational districts of the country thereby addressing the issues of inequity in medical education. Total 23 medical colleges were approved in Rajasthan State at Districts Barmer; Bharatpur; Bhilwara; Churu; Dungarpur; Pali; Sikar; Dholpur; Alwar; Baran; Bansawara; Chittorgarh; Jaisalmer; Karauli; Nagaur; ShriGanganagar; Sirohi; Bundi; Sawai Madhopur; Tonk; Hanumangarh; Jhunjhunu and Dausa.

- The details of funds released under National Health Mission (NHM) from FY 2022-23 to FY 2024-25 to the State of Rajasthan is as under:
