RISE IN DRUG RELATED CASES IN KERALA

1196 SHRI HARIS BEERAN:

Will the Minister of Home Affairs be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Kerala state has the highest rate of drug related cases in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the number of drug cases registered under the Narcotics and Psychotropic Substance Act, 1985 in Kerala for the last four years; and
- (d) whether Government has taken any strong measures to prevent the supply of drugs to educational institutions and vulnerable populations?

## **ANSWER**

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI NITYANAND RAI)

(a) to (c): As per latest data published by National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) pertaining to the year 2022; State-wise and year-wise details of drug cases registered under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 (including Kerala) during 2019 to 2022 is as at Annexure-I

The government has taken various steps to curb the drug supply in the country including educational institutions and vulnerable population. The major steps are setting up a four-tier Narco-Coordination Centre (NCORD) mechanism to enhance coordination between Central & State Drug Law Enforcement Agencies (DLEAs), formation of a dedicated Anti-Narcotics Task Force (ANTF) in every state, Joint Coordination Committee under the chairmanship of Director General Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) to monitor significant seizure cases, coordination with other agencies like Navy, Coast Guard, Border Security Force, State ANTF, etc. to conduct joint operations to control the drug trafficking, capacity building of other DLEAs, launch of Madak-Padarth Nished Asoochna Kendra (MANAS) helpline No. 1933 for drug information/complaint etc. In addition, Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) has taken cognizance of drug abuse in schools and initiated various measures for anti-drug education in schools, child safety measures like activities to prevent use of harmful substances etc., workshops, in class lessons, counselling and awareness sessions for students, staff and parents, referral mechanism for therapeutic counselling, appointment of full time counsellor and wellness teacher, observation of international anti-drug days, participation in Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan etc.
