TREND IN SOCIO-ECONOMIC INDICATORS IN THE STATE OF MADHYA PRADESH

158. SMT. MAYA NAROLIYA:

Will the Minister of STATISTICS AND PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether any significant trend has been observed in socio-economic indicators (such as population growth, literacy rate, health, nutrition, unemployment, etc.) of the State of Madhya Pradesh in recent years;
- (b) whether Government has taken any special initiative to update and make the statistical data accessible at district level in the State of Madhya Pradesh to strengthen the planning process of the State; and
- (c) whether Government is working on any long-term strategy to increase the number and quality of statistical surveys for monitoring the programmes related to infrastructure, human development, women empowerment, and employment generation in the State of Madhya Pradesh?

ANSWER

(a): From the Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) conducted by the National Sample Survey (NSS) under the Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation (MoSPI) during July 2021 - June 2022 to July 2023- June 2024, the estimates of Literacy Rates (in percent) among persons of age groups 7 years and above and Unemployment Rate in usual status (ps+ss) for persons of all ages in the State of Madhya Pradesh are given below in Table 1:

Further, two back-to-back surveys on Household Consumption Expenditure (HCES) were conducted during August, 2022 - July, 2023 and August, 2023 - July, 2024. From the results of these two surveys, the estimated Average per capita per day intake of calorie, protein and fat for the State of Madhya Pradesh separately for rural and urban sectors has been given below in Table 2:

The survey on health to generate basic quantitative information on the health sector was last conducted during July 2017 - June 2018. To update these insights, survey on Household Social Consumption – Health, has been launched in January 2025 for a survey period of one year. The trends in population growth are not estimated in surveys of MoSPI.

(b): NSS, MoSPI conducts a wide range of socio-economic surveys across the country, including Madhya Pradesh. These surveys provide vital statistical estimates at the national and State/UT levels. However, due to sample size limitations, generating reliable estimates at the district level is not feasible from the NSS central sample data. To overcome this limitation and enable data-driven planning at more granular levels, States and UTs are being encouraged to participate in NSS surveys. In almost all surveys, sampling design has been modified from the month of January 2025 with a provision for generating district level estimates with district as a basic stratum. MoSPI also provides support to the States/UTs in the form of CAPI implementation, cloud servers, trainings and financial assistance under the SSS scheme for the purchase of tablets.

(c): NSS, MoSPI conducts a wide range of surveys across the country including targeted thematic surveys scheduled at strategic intervals considering the survey requests from various Ministries. These surveys cover various socio-economic indicators such as employment and unemployment, health, education, household consumption expenditure, disability, domestic tourism, etc. Each survey yields vital insights that inform development monitoring and guide policy decisions across various sectors. Modern IT tools are being adopted for improved data capturing and processing. As a part of this, all the NSS surveys are being conducted in digital platform using Computer Assisted Personal Interview (CAPI) with in-built validation mechanism to ensure consistency at the stage of data collection and facilitating simultaneous data processing.
