#### MID-FLIGHT ENGINE FAILURES

- (a) whether Government has taken note of several mid-flight engine failures in flights and may day calls during the recent past;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, including the number of such incidents during 2025, airline-wise;
- (c) whether any measures have been taken to avoid such incidents; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

(a) and (b): During 2025, from January to July (till date), a total of 06 incidents of engine shutdown and a total of 03 incidents of May Day calls have been reported. The details are as under:-
