DEVELOPMENTAL WORK AT PARADEEP PORT

1919. SHRI MUZIBULLA KHAN:

Will the Minister of PORTS, SHIPPING AND WATERWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) the cargo handling capacity and performance of Paradeep Port in the last three years;
- (b) the status of ongoing expansion projects;
- (c) whether the port faces congestion or connectivity issues;
- (d) the steps taken to enhance port connectivity via rail and road; and
- (e) the plans for green port development?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF PORTS, SHIPPING AND WATERWAYS (SHRI SARBANANDA SONOWAL)

- (a) Paradip Port's current capacity is 289.75 MTPA. Performance wise, Cargo handled at the Port grew from 135.36 MT in FY 2022-23 to 150.41 MT in FY 2024-25. Average turnaround time improved from 46.27 hours to 41.61 hours between FY 2022-23 and FY 2023-24.
- (b) The port is currently expanding with projects including the deepening and optimization of inner harbor facilities, developing a Western Dock on a BOT basis, and mechanizing the CQ-III Berth for dry bulk cargo.
- (c) and (d) No. To improve connectivity, the Port is upgrading the Paradip-Chandikol section of NH-53 to 8 lanes. Rail projects include new auto signaling, doubling lines from Sabalpur to Talcher and Banspani-Daitari-Tomka-Jakhapura, and adding third and fourth lines between Jarapada-Budhapank-Salegaon.
- (e) Paradip Port is focusing on green initiatives such as a 10 MW solar power plant, shore-to-ship power supply, mechanizing berths, and creating a dedicated jetty for green hydrogen projects.
