Fisheries sector development in coastal Odisha

1982. Shri Manas Ranjan Mangaraj:

Will the Minister of *Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying* be pleased to state:

- (a) the contribution of Odisha's fisheries sector to the State's economy;
- (b) whether Government has supported fish farmers through Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojna (PMMSY) in Odisha;
- (c) the details of cold chain infrastructure in coastal districts of Odisha;
- (d) whether Odisha has requested more funds for inland fisheries; and
- (e) the measures taken to prevent marine pollution affecting fishery resources in the State?

ANSWER

**MINISTER OF STATE FOR FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING
(SHRI GEORGE KURIAN)**

(a): The contribution of Odisha's fisheries sector to the State's economy is Rs. 19855.00 Cr. with 2.09 % contribution of Gross State Values (GSV).

(b): The Department of Fisheries, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairying, Government of India has approved the proposals of the Government of Odisha under the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY) at a total project cost of Rs.1298.25 Crore for development of fisheries and aquaculture in the state of Odisha. Further, the proposal of Paradip Port Trust for up gradation and modernization of the Paradip fishing harbor was approved at a cost of Rs.108.91 crore under the central sector scheme component of PMMSY. The Government of Odisha has also reported that 48101 beneficiaries in Odisha District including 8970 women beneficiaries benefited under the PMMSY.

(c): The list of District wise cold chain infrastructure available in Odisha is furnished in the Annexure I.

(d) & (e): Odisha has requested more funds for inland fisheries as compared to Marine and Brackish water sectors. The Government of Odisha has informed that the Pollution Control Board, Govt. of Odisha is carrying out several measures for minimizing marine pollution. Further, the Department of Fisheries &ARD, Govt. of Odisha is conducting regular awareness programme through its field officials in various fishing harbours and fish landing centers to prevent marine pollution.
