LONDA-MIRAJ TRACK DOUBLING PROJECT

2360 SHRI IRANNA KADADI:

Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) the current status of the Londa-Miraj track doubling project and the timeline for its full completion;
- (b) the status of the proposed new railway line between Belagavi (Belgaum) and Dharwad via Kittur, including land acquisition and fund allocation;
- (c) the details of the redevelopment plan for the Belagavi Railway station under the Amrit Bharat Station Scheme, along with the project cost and expected completion date; and
- (d) the steps being taken to introduce new train services from Belagavi to major cities like Chennai and Kolkata?

(a) to (d): Budget allocation in the recent years has increased significantly. Budget allocation for infrastructure projects and safety works, falling fully/partly in the State of Karnataka is as under:

As on 01.04.2025, 25 projects (15 new lines, 10 Doubling) of 3,264 km length, costing ₹ 42,517 crore falling fully/partly in Karnataka are sanctioned, out of which 1,394 Km length has been commissioned and an expenditure of ₹21,310 Crore has been incurred upto March' 2025. Belgaum – Dharwad via Kittur (73 Km) new line project was sanctioned in 2020-21 on cost sharing basis with State Government of Karnataka at a cost of Rs.927 cr. Government of Karnataka has to provide land free of cost and to share 50% construction cost of the project. 531 Ha land is to be acquired for this project. However, land is yet to be acquired by Govt. of Karnataka for this project.

Despite the fact that Government of India has been progressively allocating record funds for railway projects, many projects in Karnataka are still delayed due to slow pace of land acquisition. Some of the projects delayed due to land acquisition are given as under:-

Government of India is geared up to execute projects, however success depends upon the support of Government of Karnataka.

Railway infrastructure projects falling fully/partly in the State of Karnataka are covered under South Western Railway (SWR), Central Railway (CR), Southern Railway (SR) and South Central Railway (SCR) zones of Indian Railways. Zonal Railway wise details of Railway projects are made available in public domain on Indian Railway's website.

Completion of Railway project/s depends on various factors like quick land acquisition by State Government, forest clearance by officials of forest department, shifting of infringing utilities, statutory clearances from various authorities, geological and topographical conditions of area, law and order situation in the area of project/s site, number of working months in a year for particular project site etc. All these factors affect the completion time and cost of the project/s.

Station Redevelopment:

At Belagavi railway station, the work of coach indication boards, train indication boards, public announcement system and clocks have been completed. The works of 12 m Foot Over Bridge, lift, escalator, improvement of platform shelter, parking and circulating area have been taken up.

Ministry of Railways has launched Amrit Bharat Station Scheme for development of stations on a continuous basis with a long-term approach. It involves preparation of master plans and their implementation in phases to improve the amenities at the stations like improvement of station access, circulating areas, waiting halls, toilets, lift/escalators as necessary, platform surfacing and cover over platform, cleanliness, free Wi-Fi, kiosks for local products through schemes like 'One Station One Product', better passenger information systems, executive lounges, nominated spaces for business meetings, landscaping, etc. keeping in view the necessity at each station.

The scheme also envisages improvement of building, integrating the station with both sides of the city, multimodal integration, amenities for Divyangjans, sustainable and environment friendly solutions, provision of ballastless tracks, etc. as per necessity, phasing and feasibility and creation of city centre at the station in the long term.

Development works at railway stations under Amrit Bharat Station Scheme have been taken up at a good pace. So far, 1337 stations including Belagavi Station have been identified for development under Amrit Bharat Station Scheme. Till now, phase–I works of 105 stations have been completed. Names of these stations are as following:

Further, development / redevelopment / upgradation / modernisation of stations on Indian Railways is a continuous and ongoing process and works in this regard are undertaken as per requirement, subject to inter-se priority and availability of funds. The priority for development / redevelopment / upgradation / modernisation of stations is accorded to higher category of station over lower category of station while sanctioning and executing the works.

Development / Upgradation of railway stations is complex in nature involving safety of passengers & trains and requires various statutory clearances such as fire clearance, heritage, tree cutting, airport clearance etc. The progress also gets affected due to brownfield related challenges such as shifting of utilities (involving water/sewage lines, optical fibre cables, gas pipe lines, power/signal cables, etc.), infringements, operation of trains without hindering passenger movement, speed restrictions due to works carried out in close proximity of tracks and high voltage power lines, etc. and these factors affect the completion time. Therefore, no time frame can be indicated at this stage.

Development / Upgradation / Modernisation of stations including under Amrit Bharat Station Scheme is generally funded under Plan Head–53 'Customer Amenities'. The details of allocation and expenditure under Plan Head–53 are maintained Zonal Railway-wise and not work-wise, or station wise or state-wise. The fund allocation of ₹ 12,118 crore has been made for the financial

year 2025-26 under Plan Head-53 and expenditure (up to June, 2025) of ₹ 2,612 crore has been incurred so far.

Trains at Belagavi Station:

Belagavi Station is presently being served by 50 Mail/Express Including 20669/20670 Hubballi-Pune Vande Bharat Express (via Belagavi) introduced w.e.f. 18.09.2024. These services are providing connectivity to various cities like Mysuru, Delhi, Mumbai, Bengaluru, Ahmedabad, etc.

Besides, Indian Railways constantly endeavours to provide/improve connectivity for the passengers, which is an on-going process subject to traffic justification, operational feasibility, availability of resources, competing demands etc.
