SPECIAL TRAINS FOR UPCOMING FESTIVALS LIKE DEEPAWALI, MAHAPARVA CHHATH

Will the Minister of Railways be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Railways has planned to run special trains in view of the upcoming festivals like Deepawali, Mahaparva Chhath,
- (b) whether the Railways has taken any steps to improve connectivity from Bihar to other States; and
- (c) whether the East Central Railway and Eastern Railway zones have proposed to start more train services from Bihar to other States in the past years in view of increasing demand for more trains?

ANSWER

(a) to (c) Indian Railways constantly endeavours to cater to the growing needs of travelling passengers. To this end, new services are introduced, existing train services are extended and their frequency increased. Besides, augmentation of loads of existing train services is also undertaken. These are ongoing processes, subject to operational feasibility, resource availability, competing demands etc.

As the Railway network straddles across state boundaries, trains are introduced, as per network requirement, across such boundaries. However, to provide/improve connectivity for the passengers, Indian Railways, between the period 2024-25 and 2025-26 (till 31.07.2025) have, on originating/terminating basis, introduced 46 train services serving the stations located in the State of Bihar which include the following 12 services introduced since April, 2025:

- 1. 94802/04 Jaynagar-Patna Namo Bharat Rapid Rail
- 2. 11015/16 Lokmanya Tilak (T)- Saharsa Amrit Bharat Express

- 3. 26501/02 Gorakhpur-Patliputra Vande Bharat Express
- 4. 15561/62 Darbhanga-Gomtinagar Amrit Bharat Express
- 5. 15567/68 Bapudham Motihari-Anand Vihar(T) Amrit Bharat Express
- 6. 22361/62 Rajendra Nagar-New Delhi Amrit Bharat Express

Moreover, to cater to the extra rush of passengers during peak seasons, festivals, special events, etc. Indian Railways also operates special trains and augments the loads of existing services, keeping in view the pattern of traffic, commercial justification, operational feasibility and availability of resources etc. These are on-going processes.

Accordingly, during the year 2024 and 2025, around 13,500 trips of special trains each year have been operated to cater to the extra rush of passengers during Holi festival and Summer vacations.

IR, also catered to the rush of passengers during Durga Pooja/Dipawali/Chhath by operating 7990 trips of Special trains during the period 1st October, 2024 to 30th November, 2024 which served approximately 1.8 crore passengers.

In order to cater to the needs of passengers and facilitate their journey during Maha Kumbh-2025, Indian Railways operated more than 17,300 trains which included 7484 Special trains. All these measures served approximately 4.24 crore passengers visiting Maha Khumbh.

To generate additional accommodation for different segments of passengers, IR during the period 2023-24 to 2025-26(till June, 2025), utilised 2275 coaches for augmentation of train services on a permanent basis.

To improve connectivity, the Railway projects are surveyed/sanctioned/executed Zonal Railway-wise and not State-wise as the Railway projects may span across State boundaries.

Railway infrastructural Projects in the State of Bihar are covered by East Central Railway (ECR), Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR), Eastern Railway (ER), North Eastern Railway (NER) Zone of Indian Railways. Zonal Railway wise details of Railway projects are made available in public domain on Indian Railway's website.

As on 01.04.2025, 52 projects(31 New Lines, 01 Gauge Conversions and 20 Doubling), of a total length of 4,663 km, costing ₹86,107 crore, falling fully/partly in Bihar, are sanctioned, out of which 1,014 km length has been commissioned and an expenditure of ₹29,353 crore has been incurred upto March' 2025. The above projects include three important bridges across Ganga and Kosi rivers viz Munger bridge, Patna Bridge and Kosi bridge. These are mega bridges with longer spans requiring expertise of high nature. Therefore, IITs/NITs were engaged for checking the designs and methodology of construction of these bridges.

Though these Bridges were sanctioned long before 2014 but substantial progress in the construction of these bridges could be achieved only after 2014. Proper planning, adoption of efficient execution methodologies and availability of sufficient funds were ensured for expediting these projects in Bihar.
