INCREASE IN CASES OF MDR AND XDR-TB

3001 SMT. RAJANI ASHOKRAO PATIL:

Will the **Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there has been an increase in cases of multi-drug-resistant (MDR) and Extensively Drug-Resistant Tuberculosis (XDR-TB) in the last two years;
- (b) the number of DR-TB cases reported in 2023 and 2024, State-wise;
- (c) whether there are adequate DR-TB treatment centres across high-burden districts;
- (d) whether India's National Strategic Plan for TB Elimination (2020–2025) is on track; and
- (e) the steps being taken to ensure uninterrupted supply of newer TB drugs like Bedaquiline and Delamanid?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SMT. ANUPRIYA PATEL)

(a) to (e) The National TB Elimination Programme (NTEP) is implemented across the country under the aegis of the National Health Mission (NHM). With enhanced efforts by the Government to identify all TB cases, the notification of TB cases has increased consistently. Under NTEP, the number of reported cases of multi-drug-resistant (MDR) and Extensively Drug-Resistant Tuberculosis (XDR-TB) in the last two years is as under:

The State-wise details of drug resistant TB cases reported is placed as **Annexure**.

To ensure access to appropriate treatment, 815 Drug Resistant TB treatment centres have been established covering all districts of the country.

As per the World Health Organisation's Global TB Report, 2024, the incidence rate of TB in India has shown a 17.7% decline from 237 per lakh population in 2015 to 195 per lakh population in 2023, which is more than double the global reduction, while deaths due to TB has reduced by 21.4% from 28 per lakh population in 2015 to 22 per lakh population in 2023.

Under NTEP, adequate availability and uninterrupted supply of anti-TB drugs including Bedaquiline, Pretomanid, Linezolid & Moxifloxacin is ensured. The Government conducts regular assessment to monitor stock levels across states /UTs. Release Orders / Transfers Orders are issued routinely from central level to the State/UTs to replenish the stock position of anti TB drugs. Additionally, States and UTs have been equipped with resources under NHM for local procurement of anti-tuberculosis drugs in limited quantities, to address any emergent needs promptly.
