PROGRESS REPORT OF JAL JEEVAN MISSION IN UTTARAKHAND

879 # SHRI MAHENDRA BHATT:

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) whether all the families of the State of Uttarakhand have been connected with the Har Ghar Nal Se Jal Yojana under Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM);
- (b) whether Government is aware that despite laying of drinking water lines, water supply is still not being provided to many families;
- (c) if so, the reasons therefor; and
- (d) the time by when deprived families will be provided with water supply?

(a) to (d) Government of India, in partnership with States/ UTs including Uttarakhand is implementing Jal Jeevan Mission, since August, 2019, to make provision of tap water supply to every rural household in the country.

Significant progress has been made in the state since the launch of Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM), towards enhancing access to tap water to rural households. At the start of Jal Jeevan Mission in August 2019, 1.30 lakh (9%) rural households were reported to have tap water connections in Uttarakhand. So far, as reported by the State, around 12.84 lakh additional rural households have been provided with tap water connections under JJM. Thus, as on 22.07.2025, out of 14.49 lakh rural households in the Uttarakhand, more than 14.14 lakh (97.63%) households are reported to have tap water supply in their homes.

As reported by the State of Uttarakhand, it has planned to achieve 100% FHTC (Functional household tap connection) coverage by December 2025.
