Will the Minister of *Ayush* be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Ayushman Arogya Mandirs (Ayush) established under NAM since its inception, State-wise including Jharkhand;
- (b) the total number of beneficiaries who have availed services from these centres to date;
- (c) whether the Ministry has assessed the impact of these centres on public health outcomes;
- (d) if so, the key findings of such assessments and any measures taken to enhance the effectiveness of Ayush services;
- (e) the number of Ayushman Arogya Mandirs operational in Gujarat and total beneficiaries served as of June, 2025; and
- (f) whether any Model Ayushman Mandirs have been established in Gujarat's tourist or tribal districts?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE (IC) OF THE MINISTRY OF AYUSH (SHRI PRATAPRAO JADHAV)

(a) & (b) Under Centrally Sponsored Scheme National Ayush Mission (NAM), as per the proposals received from State / UT Governments including Jharkhand through their State Annual Action Plans (SAAPs), 12500 units of existing Ayush dispensaries and Sub Health Centres have been approved to be upgraded as Ayushman Arogya Mandir Ayush [AAM (Ayush)]. The State wise status of approved and functional AAM (Ayush) including

Jharkhand is furnished at **Annexure**. Further, as reported by States/UTs, a total number of 11.56 Crore beneficiaries availed the services through these AAM(Ayush) during the year 2024.

(c) & d) Yes. There are third party review and also NABH assessment besides visit by the Central team in different States/UTs to review the implementation progress of different activities/services being provided by the 12,500 operational Ayushman Arogya Mandir (Ayush) [AAM (Ayush)] which were approved with an objective to establish a holistic wellness model based on Ayush principles and practices focusing on preventive, promotive, curative, rehabilitative healthcare by establishing integration with existing public healthcare system to provide informed choice to the needy public by making Ayush services available in a team based approach.

It has been observed by visiting teams that footfall of the beneficiaries visiting to the AAM (Ayush) has been subsequently increased after upgradation of Ayush Dispensaries/Sub health centers into AAM (Ayush) because in addition to OPD services, these facilities are also providing various other services like Prakriti Parikshan, Yoga related activities at the level of facility as well as community, awareness about uses of common medicinal plants etc. Further, State/UT Governments have been suggested by the visiting team for appropriate training & capacity building of AAM (Ayush) team, strengthening of referral linkages with other public health facilities, effective involvement of field level workers specially ASHAs etc. for better outcome of the activities being conducted through AAM (Ayush).

(e) & (f) Under NAM, a total of 365 Ayushman Arogya Mandirs (Ayush) are operational in Gujarat State and as reported by the State Government total 62,13,367 beneficiaries have been served till June, 2025. Further, as reported by State Government of Gujrat out of 365 AAM (Ayush), 73 are in State's tourist and tribal districts.
