DIRECTIVES FOR OCCUPATIONAL HEAT-RELATED CASES

Will the Minister of Labour and Employment be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Ministry maintains a national register of heat-related occupational illnesses/deaths among outdoor workers and if so, the details of such cases reported during 2024 and 2025 (till date), sector-wise; and**
- (b) the details of directives, if any, issued to employers/States for heat action plans, hydration breaks and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)?**

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PART (a) & (b) OF RAJYA SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. *127 FOR REPLY ON 11.12.2025 RAISED BY SHRI SAKET GOKHALE REGARDING DIRECTIVES FOR OCCUPATIONAL HEAT-RELATED CASES.

(a) & (b): The Government has enacted the Occupational Safety Health & Working Conditions (OSH&WC) Code, 2020, which has come into force on 21.11.2025. It provides for occupational safety, health and welfare of workers working in the establishments registered under the Code. The Code has elaborate provisions for ensuring ventilation and temperature control, artificial humidification etc. to deal with heat conditions at the work places.

As per available data, the details of deaths including workers, due to heat/sun stroke during 2022-2023, as furnished by States/Union Territories to the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB), is at Annexure.

The Government has issued advisories to States and Union Territories, requesting them to take proactive measures and issue necessary instruction/directions to employers/industries/construction companies in their jurisdiction to take steps to mitigate the adverse effects of extreme hot weather on workers. These steps include rescheduling of working hours, ensuring adequate drinking water facilities, conducting regular health check-ups for workers, providing emergency ice packs etc.

The organisations under the Ministry of Labour and Employment also organize regular training programs/awareness sessions focused on ways to deal with the heat wave for workers and labourers who are most exposed to extreme heat conditions.

The Indian Meteorological Department has taken multiple steps to improve monitoring and early warning systems, which helped minimize loss of life and property during extreme weather events, including heat waves. Heat Action Plans (HAPs) in States that are prone to heat wave conditions are jointly implemented by the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) in collaboration with the State Governments.
