- (a) the sanctioned strength and actual number of Doctors and Specialists working in all Central Government Hospitals, Hospital-wise;
- (b) the sanctioned strength and actual number of Nurses, Paramedical and other Support Staff in all Central Government Hospitals, Hospital-wise; and
- (c) the proposed timeline for filling these vacancies?

(a) & (b) The Sanctioned Strength and actual number of Doctors/Specialists and other Staff (Nursing, Paramedical and Supporting Staff) working in four Central Government hospitals, namely Vardhman Mahavir Medical College & Safdarjung Hospital (VMMC & SJH), New Delhi, Atal Bihari Vajpayee Institute of Medical Sciences & Dr Ram Manohar Lohia Hospital, (ABVIMS & RMLH), New Delhi, Lady Hardinge Medical College & Smt. Sucheta Kriplani & Associated Hospitals (LHMC & SSKH), New Delhi and Rural Health Training Centre (RHTC), Najafgarh, Delhi are annexed at Annexure.

(c): Following steps are taken by Ministry/Central Government Hospitals to fill up the vacancies on regular basis:

Filling up of vacant posts is an ongoing process. Every year on the basis of vacancies projected by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) conducts Combined Medical Service Examination (CMSE) for recruitment of Medical Officers of General Duty Medical Officers sub-cadre of Central Health Service. UPSC also conducts interviews for recruitment of Specialist doctors in Teaching, Non-Teaching and Public Health sub-cadres of Central Health Service (CHS) as per requisitions submitted by the Ministry from time to time.

Central Government Hospitals conduct recruitment exercises/ examinations through Nursing Officers Recruitment Common Eligibility Test (NORCET), Staff Selection Commission (SSC) and Common Recruitment Examination (CRE) to fill up vacant posts of Nurses, Paramedical and other support staff.

Further, Central Government Hospitals make contractual appointments against the vacant posts, as a temporary arrangement, in public interest.
