**SUB QUOTA IN MINORITY SCHEMES**

1723. DR. VIKRAMJIT SINGH SAHNEY:

Will the Minister of MINORITY AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) details of the population percentage of 6 minority communities who get benefits of various schemes of Government;
- (b) whether Government is planning to introduce sub-quotas as per Supreme Court Judgement of Indra Sawhney (1992) to ensure inclusivity in scheme benefits;
- (c) details of the beneficiaries of all 6 minority communities who received benefits of various schemes of Government during the last five years, year-wise, community-wise and scheme-wise;
- (d) if so, the details thereof, if not, the reasons therefor;
- (e) whether Government is planning to exempt Minority Institutions from Property Tax; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof, if not the reasons therefor?

**ANSWER**

THE MINISTER OF MINORITY AFFAIRS

(SHRI KIREN RIJU)

(a): As per Census, 2011 the population percentage of six notified minority communities is Muslim – 14.2%, Christian – 2.3%, Sikh – 1.7%, Buddhist – 0.7%, Jain – 0.4%, and Parsi – 0.005% respectively.

(b): No such proposal is under consideration of the Ministry.

(c) and (d): Ministry of Minority Affairs implements various schemes for socio-economic and educational empowerment of the six (6) centrally notified minority communities. The Schemes/programmes implemented by the Ministry are as under:

**1. Educational Empowerment Schemes**

The Ministry of Minority Affairs has implemented the following three Scholarship schemes for the educational empowerment of the six centrally notified minority communities viz. Buddhist, Christian, Jain, Muslim, Parsi and Sikh:

- i) Pre-Matric Scholarship Scheme;
- ii) Post Matric Scholarship Scheme; and
- iii) Merit-cum-Means based Scholarship Scheme.

The Schemes intend to provide financial assistance to the poor and meritorious students belonging to religious minority communities to enable them to pursue professional and technical courses. The Scholarship schemes, however, have not been approved for implementation beyond 2021-22.

Apart from scholarship schemes, this Ministry implemented PadhoPardesh scheme to award interest subsidy on educational loan to minority students for studying abroad to pursue approved courses of study at Masters, M.Phil. and Ph.D. levels. The scheme has been discontinued from FY 2022-23 as education loan is available at cheaper rates through various other Government interventions.

The Maulana Azad National Fellowship (MANF) scheme intended to provide fellowships in the form of financial assistance to students belonging to the minority communities to pursue degrees in higher education such as M.Phil. and Ph.D. in India. The scheme has been discontinued from 2022-23 due to its apparent overlapping with similar schemes of other Ministries. The fellowship to existing beneficiaries would continue till the completion of their studies as per extant guidelines.

The year-wise, community-wise, scheme-wise number of beneficiaries under these schemes during the last 5 years are at Annexure-I.

## 2. Employment and Economic Empowerment Schemes

i) The **Pradhan Mantri Virasat Ka Samvardhan (PM VIKAS)** is a flagship Scheme of MoMA which converges five erstwhile schemes, including Seekho aur Kamao (2013-2021), USTTAD & Hamari Dharohar (2016-2019), Nai Manzil (2016-2018) and Nai Roshni (2012-2021). The Central Sector scheme focuses on the socio-economic empowerment of the six notified minority communities through skill development; entrepreneurship and leadership of minority women; and education support for school dropouts.

Since the erstwhile schemes were discontinued for convergence under PM VIKAS, no targets were allocated in the Nai Manzil and USTTAD & Hamari Dharohar schemes in the last five years. Targets were allocated under Nai Roshni and Seekho Aur Kamao in 2020-21 (last target year), as follows:

ii) **National Minorities Development and Finance Corporation (NMDFC)** implements its schemes for socio-economic development of “backward sections” among the notified minority communities by providing concessional loan for self-employment income generation ventures across the country. The details of the beneficiaries belonging to notified minority communities who have received benefits under NMDFC scheme, during the last five years, year-wise and community-wise, is as below:

### 3. Infrastructure Development Scheme

Pradhan Mantri Jan Vikas Karyakram" (PMJVK), a Centrally Sponsored Scheme, is one of the flagship program of the Ministry of Minority Affairs for creation of community infrastructure in the Minority Concentration Areas of the country in the sectors viz. Health, Skill Development, Education, Women Centric Projects, Drinking Water and Supply, Sanitation, Sports, Renewable energy, Tourism, Animal Husbandry and Other Community Infrastructure.

Further, PMJVKs a community infrastructure development scheme and thus the infrastructure developed is for the benefits of the whole population of the respective minority concentration areas.

### 4. Special Schemes

**JiyoParsi:** In order to arrest the decline in population and reverse the trend, the Ministry formulated the Jiyo Parsi Scheme in September 2013.

The assistance being provided under the scheme is related to infertility treatment, child health, maternal health, child care and elderly care. The details of financial assistance provided under the scheme during the last 5 years are as under:
