FCI STORAGE CAPACITY IN WEST BENGAL

1801 SHRI SAMIK BHATTACHARYA:

Will the Minister of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution be pleased to state:

- (a) the total storage capacity of FCI in West Bengal, along with the exact capacities and locations of major godowns and depots at Dankuni, Haldia, Durgapur, Siliguri, Asansol, Kolkata (Rice Mill Street), Kalyani, Alipurduar, Malda and Bankura;
- (b) whether FCI has undertaken projects to modernise, digitise and augment storage infrastructure in the State, including silos, CAP upgrades, new warehouses and depot mechanisation;
- (c) the details, timelines, land availability issues, delays or State-level non-cooperation affecting these projects; and
- (d) the funds allocated and spent during the last five years, year-wise and district-wise, including audit observations on shortages, damage or stock-movement inefficiencies?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR MINISTRY OF CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD & PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION (SHRIMATI NIMUBEN JAYANTIBHAI BAMBHANIYA)

- (a): The total gross storage capacity of FCI in West Bengal is 9.52 LMT. Details of capacity is at **Annexure-I**.
- (b): FCI has successfully rolled out various schemes towards modernization, digitization and augmenting storage infrastructure.

FCI has also successfully rolled out the Depot Darpan Portal across the Country including West Bengal whereas the depot infrastructure, manpower and Stock safety and environmental safety are some key areas that are focused upon. Silo is also operational at 02 locations (Bandel and Balurghat) having total capacity of 0.75 LMT.

Silos are constructed in PPP mode.

(c): The Government through FCI undertakes regular maintenance work which is recurring in nature (i.e. ARMO Work) and regular upgradation of road work by providing CC and replacement of roof by providing profile sheet throughout the Depot of West Bengal region.

(d): The projects/initiatives stated at point (a) to (c) above initiated in different modes, construction of silos in Public Private Partnership(PPP) mode, smart warehouse project and Depot Darpan in CWC through its own fund and in FCI it is being carried out through fund allocated by DFPD.

Civil engineering division has undertaken only regular maintenance work which is recurring in nature (i.e. ARMO Work) and regular upgradation of road work by providing CC and replacement of roof by providing profile sheet throughout the Depot of West Bengal region.

Further, audit observations on shortages, damage or stock-movement inefficiencies are at **Annexure-II.**
