NATIONAL RURAL LIVELIHOOD MISSION IN ASSAM

Will the Minister of Rural Development be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the funds allocated, released and expended by Assam under the Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Rural Livelihood Mission (DAY-NRLM) during the last five years;
- (b) the number of Institutions of the Poor (IoP) recognised in Assam under the DAY-NRLM, district-wise;
- (c) the details and the number of IoPs that specifically cater to female tribal population in Assam, year-wise; and
- (d) the number of individuals who have been trained under the DAY-NRLM's Aajeevika Skills Development Programme in Assam during the said period?

- (a): Details of the funds allocated, released and expended by Assam under the Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana- National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM) during last five years are given at **Annexure-I**.
- (b): Under the Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Rural Livelihood Mission (DAY NRLM), Institutions of the Poor (IoP) are formed which are called as Self-Help Groups (SHGs). District-wise number of SHGs promoted in Assam under the DAY-NRLM is given at **Annexure-II**.
- (c): Details of number of SHGs promoted under DAY-NRLM belonging to Scheduled Tribes (STs) in Assam are given at **Annexure-III**.
- (d): There are two sub-schemes under **DAY-NRLM**—namely **Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY)** and **Rural Self Employment Training Institutes (RSETI)** that focus on the skill development of rural poor youth to provide gainful employment and eradicate poverty in the country. During the last five years, a total of 33,897 number of individuals have been trained under DDU-GKY and a total of 75,782 individuals have been trained under RSETI in the State of Assam.
