UPGRADATION OF CIVIL HOSPITAL IN KOLHAPUR

284. SHRI DHANANJAY BHIMRAO MAHADIK:

Will the **Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government has sanctioned funds for the upgradation of Chhatrapati Pramila Raje Civil Hospital in Kolhapur;
- (b) the status of construction of new primary health centres in flood-prone rural areas;
- (c) whether any proposal has been received to establish a medical college under a centrally sponsored scheme; and
- (d) the measures taken to strengthen healthcare infrastructure and disease surveillance in the district?

(a) to (d): The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare provides technical and financial support to the States/UTs including the State of Maharashtra to strengthen the healthcare facilities, based on the proposals received in the form of Programme Implementation Plans (PIPs) under **National Health Mission (NHM)**. Government of India provides approval for the proposal in the form of Record of Proceedings (RoPs) as per norms & available resources.

Health Dynamics of India (HDI) (Infrastructure & Human Resources), 2022-23 is an annual publication, based on healthcare administrative data reported by States/UTs. As per Health Dynamics of India (HDI) 2022-23, there are 413 Sub-health centres (SHCs), 96 Primary Health Centres (PHCs), 22 Community Health Centres (CHCs), 4 Sub-Divisional Hospitals (SDHs) and 1 Medical College in Kolhapur district of Maharashtra.

Construction of 4 new PHCs have been approved in Kolhapur District including flood-prone rural areas under NHM in 2023-24.

Rajarshee Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj Govt. Medical College, affiliated to Chhatrapati Pramila Raje Hospital has already been established in Kolhapur district by Government of Maharashtra.

Under Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) for ‘Establishment of new medical colleges attached with existing district/referral hospitals’, out of 157 medical colleges approved, 02 medical colleges have been approved in Gondia and Nandurbar district in Maharashtra.

The **Pradhan Mantri Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM-ABHIM)**, with an outlay of Rs.64,180 crore, aims to support for infrastructure development for SHCs, Urban Health and Wellness Centres, Support for Block Public Health Units, Integrated Public Health Laboratories (IPHL) and Critical Care Blocks (CCB). 1 IPHL and a 50-bedded CCB have been approved for Kolhapur district under PM-ABHIM.

The **XV-Finance Commission (FC)** has recommended grants aggregating to Rs.70,051 crore over the period of five years (2021-2026) through Local Governments to strengthen the healthcare system in States. Under XV-FC, 12 Block Public Health Units (BPHUs) have been approved in Kolhapur district.

The **Integrated Disease Surveillance Programme (IDSP)**, is an important programme under NHM, which is mandated with surveillance & response to outbreak prone communicable diseases. IDSP is implemented in all 36 States/UTs. Under this program, there is a Central surveillance Unit (CSU) at Central level, State Surveillance Unit (SSU) at the State/UTs level and District Surveillance Unit (DSU) at district level including Kolhapur. The program is responsible for the surveillance of 50 plus epidemic prone diseases. **Integrated Health Information Platform (IHIP)** provides a single operating platform of public health surveillance of the individuals at District, State and National levels.
