SKILL DEVELOPMENT IN THE AVIATION SECTOR

Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:-

- (a) whether the Airports Authority of India (AAI) has entered into a strategic partnership with the National Skill Development Fund (NSDF) and the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) for skill development in the aviation sector;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the outcomes achieved;
- (c) the details of the financial assistance provided for this purpose during each of the last three years and the current year, year-wise; and
- (d) the number of trained individuals who have secured employment in the aviation sector in recent years and the career paths ensured for them by Government?

ANSWER

Minister of State in the Ministry of CIVIL AVIATION (Shri Murlidhar Mohol)

(a) Airports Authority of India has signed two tripartite MoUs under CSR with National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) and National Skill Development Fund (NSDF) for setting up of Multi Skill Development Centre at Chandigarh & Mumbai.

(b) to (d) Under the vision Aviation Multi Skill Development Centre has been established at Chandigarh and Mumbai which has trained 1452 and 511 individuals, respectively. In addition, financial assistance of Rs. 79,26,000/- under this initiative has been provided during the financial year 2025-26 for setting up of Aviation Skill Development Centre at Government Degree College for Women, Srikakulam, Andhra Pradesh.

The Ministry is committed to provide enabling environment for sustainable skill development in Civil Aviation. The aviation sector offers diverse career paths and the Ministry has aligned its skill development policy as per International Civil Aviation Organization's Standards and global best practices. Employment of such trained individuals is market driven.
