**UTILIZATION OF CSR FUNDS OF NLC IN TAMIL NADU**

Will the Minister of *Coal* be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Neyveli Lignite Corporation Limited (NLC) in the State of Tamil Nadu spends CSR funds as part of their social responsibility;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, including the amount that is allocated for CSR purpose, during each of the last five years, year-wise; and
- (c) the details of the break-up of the funds as to where it is spent, how much and whether it has achieved the desired objective / purpose, during the above said period?
