“Assistance to Ayurvedic research centres”

3524. Shri A. A. Rahim:

Will the Minister of Ayush be pleased to state:

- (a) the total funds allocated and released by the Ministry for Ayurvedic research centres and institutions during the last five years, year-wise and State-wise;
- (b) the criteria adopted for allocation of financial assistance to Ayurvedic research institutions across States;
- (c) whether the Ministry is reviewing the proposals submitted by Government of Kerala seeking financial assistance for strengthening Ayurvedic research infrastructure in the State;
- (d) if so, the present status of such proposals, including the stage of examination and expected timeline for decision; and
- (e) whether there has been any delay in sanctioning assistance, if so, the reasons therefor and the steps taken to expedite the process?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE (IC) OF THE MINISTRY OF AYUSH

- (a) The Ayurvedic Research Council namely Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Sciences (CCRAS) under Ministry of Ayush undertakes research activities through its 30 Institutes / Centres / Units located all over India. The details of total funds released to these Institutes / Centres / Units by CCRAS during the last five years is attached at **Annexure-I**. Further, the details of funds allocated and released by the Ministry to Ayurvedic National Institutes during the last five years is attached at **Annexure-II**.
- (b) The funds for research work are allocated to the Research Council and National Institutes on the basis of budget proposals for research activities and other administrative & financial requirements submitted by the respective Research Council and National Institutes.
- (c) to (e) No proposal from Government of Kerala for financial assistance for strengthening Ayurveda research infrastructure in the State has been received in Ministry of Ayush.
