IMPLEMENTATION GAPS IN PM SURYA GHAR: MUFT BIJLI YOJANA

3657. SHRI K.R.N. RAJESHKUMAR

Will the Minister of NEW AND RENEWABLE ENERGY be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of rooftop solar installations completed under the PM Surya Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana against the target of one crore households by FY 2026-27, State-wise;
- (b) whether the Ministry has addressed public grievance regarding high upfront cost for economically weaker sections (EWS), and status of the Utility Led Aggregation model meant to subsidise these consumers;
- (c) the average time taken by DISCOMs (Distribution Companies) to approve net-metering applications and release central subsidy to the consumer's bank account; and
- (d) the status of the National Green Hydrogen Mission hubs in Kandla, Paradip and Tuticorin and the total quantum of green ammonia supply contracts awarded as of February 2026?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR NEW & RENEWABLE ENERGY AND POWER

(a) Under the PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana (PMSG: MBY), since its launch in February 2024, a total of 26,19,879 rooftop solar (RTS) systems have been installed across the country, as on 19.03.2026. These installations are benefitting 32,38,992 households. The state/UT wise details are given at **Annexure**.

(b) To facilitate adoption of RTS system for economically weaker sections under the PMSG: MBY, following steps have been taken by the ministry: -

- (i) Availability of collateral-free loan from nationalized banks at a concessional interest rate of repo-rate plus 50 bps, i.e., 5.75% per annum for the present, with a tenure of 10 years.
- (ii) Included RESCO/Utility-Led Aggregation (ULA) Models.

Under the ULA model of the PMSG: MBY, MNRE has sanctioned 12.58 lakh RTS installations in 10 States/UTs including Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, Kerala, Jammu & Kashmir, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Ladakh, DNH & DD, Telangana, Bihar and Tripura.

(c) Under the PMSG: MBY, the Government has simplified the regulatory approval process by waiving technical feasibility requirement and introducing auto load enhancement upto 10 kW. Also, the Net metering agreement has been made part of application in the National Portal.

Further, the entire process from application to Central Financial Assistance (CFA) disbursement is online through the National Portal. With all credentials entered correctly on the National portal, the average time taken in releasing the CFA is around 15 days after redemption request made by the consumer.

(d) Deendayal Port (Kandla, Gujarat), V. O. Chidambaram Port (Tuticorin, Tamil Nadu) and Paradip Port (Odisha) have been recognised as green hydrogen hubs under the National Green Hydrogen Mission (NGHM).

Prices have been discovered by Solar Energy Corporation of India (SECI) for the production and supply of 7,24,000 Metric Tonnes per Annum (MTPA) of Green Ammonia (a derivative of Green Hydrogen) to 13 fertilizer units across the country.
