- (a) whether Government has reviewed the implementation of the National Ayush Mission;
- (b) the details of institutions and facilities strengthened thereunder;
- (c) whether manpower shortages have been identified; and
- (d) the corrective measures taken thereon?

- (a) to (d) A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

The Statement referred in reply to Rajya Sabha Starred Question No. 24 for 21.07.2026

(a) The evaluation of National Ayush Mission (NAM) under seven (7) Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS) under the Health sector covering the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and Ministry of Ayush Umbrella Schemes has been carried out by NITI Aayog in 2025. Recently a review has been undertaken during 29th June, 2026 to 1st July, 2026 with senior functionaries of States/UTs to assess the progress of infrastructure development, service delivery, human resources, digital integration, medicines' supply and governance mechanisms under NAM. Earlier also these reviews were held during NAM Conclave on 1-2 May, 2025 and during the Departmental Summit on "National Ayush Mission and Capacity Building in States" in the month of September, 2025. Further, one to one meetings, periodic review meetings and field visits are regular features.

(b) Under NAM, as per the proposals received from State/UT Governments through State Annual Action Plans (SAAPs), financial assistance has been provided for establishment of new Ayush facilities as well as strengthening of existing facilities. The detailed status of supported facilities in the States/UTs is furnished at **Annexure**.

(c) & (d) Yes. Public Health being a State subject, the primary responsibility to deploy the manpower in the country comes under the purview of respective State/UT Governments. However, under NAM, the components for setting up of up to 50/30/10 bedded integrated Ayush Hospitals, upgradation of exclusive standalone Ayush Hospitals inter-alia are having provision for contractual deployment of Ayush Doctors and paramedics. In this regard, State/UT Governments may submit their proposals through State Annual Action Plans (SAAPs) as per provision of NAM guidelines.

Annexure

- (i) 12500 Ayushman Arogya Mandir (Ayush) have been operationalized by upgrading Ayush Dispensaries and Sub Health Centres.
- (ii) 228 units have been approved for establishment of new 10/30/50 bedded Integrated Ayush hospitals.
- (iii) 24 units have been approved for establishment of New Ayush Educational Institutions.
- (iv) 390 units have been approved for establishment of New Ayush Dispensaries.
- (v) 866 units of Ayush Hospitals and 10225 Ayush dispensaries have been approved for strengthening of infrastructure.
- (vi) 80 Under-Graduate and 49 Post-Graduate Ayush Educational Institutes have been approved for strengthening of infrastructure.
