1018. Shri Sandosh Kumar P:

Will the Minister of Corporate Affairs be pleased to state:

- (a) the total amount of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) funds spent in the State of Kerala during the last five years, year-wise;
- (b) Kerala's rank among States in terms of CSR expenditure during the said period;
- (c) the details of CSR spending in Kerala, including health, education, disaster relief, environmental sustainability and livelihood development, sector-wise;
- (d) whether Government has assessed equitable distribution of CSR funds across districts in Kerala, including tribal and coastal regions; and
- (e) whether any mechanism exists to encourage companies operating in Kerala to undertake CSR projects within the State?

(a) to (c): Based on the annual filings made by companies in the MCA21 registry, state-wise CSR expenditure in India and development sector-wise CSR expenditure in Kerala for the last five financial years (FYs) i.e. 2020-21 to 2024-25 is attached at Annexure-I & II respectively.

(d) & (e): Under the Companies Act, 2013, CSR is a Board driven process and the Board of the company is empowered to plan, decide, execute and monitor CSR activities of the company based on the recommendation of its CSR Committee. As it is a Board driven process, Government does not issue any specific direction to the companies to spend in any particular area/activity.
