**FUNCTIONING OF GOVERNMENT FUNDED HEALTHCARE INSTITUTIONS IN
ODISHA**

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of Central Government-funded healthcare institutions functioning in Odisha;
- (b) whether any new AIIMS or Central Government medical institutions are proposed in the State;
- (c) the present status thereof; and
- (d) the steps taken to strengthen tertiary healthcare facilities in Odisha?

(a) to (d): In Odisha, an All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) has been established at Bhubaneswar under the Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY). The Institute is functional and has a Satellite Centre at Balasore. Under the current phase of PMSSY, there is no proposal for the establishment of a new AIIMS in the State of Odisha. Further, in order to strengthen tertiary healthcare facilities in Odisha, various steps have been taken by Government including:

- Upgradation of three Government Medical Colleges namely MKCG Medical College, Berhampur; VSS Medical College, Burla; and Dharanidhar Medical College & Hospital, Keonjhar through construction of Super Specialty Blocks/Trauma Care Centres under PMSSY.
- Setting up of a 150-bedded Critical Care Hospital Block (CCHB) at AIIMS, Bhubaneswar under Pradhan Mantri Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM-ABHIM).
- Support for manpower development at SCB Medical College & Hospital, Cuttack under the Tertiary Care component of the National Mental Health Programme.
- Approval of Acharya Harihar Regional Cancer Centre, Cuttack as a State Cancer Institute (SCI) under the Strengthening of Tertiary Cancer Care Centres (TCCC) Scheme.
