NCD MORTALITY BURDEN IN THE COUNTRY

1077. SHRI MUKUL WASNIK:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) account for over 60 per cent of mortalities in the country, and the data on NCD deaths over the last three years, State- wise;
- (b) the steps taken to correct the spending disparity between advanced hospital care and primary, preventive care;
- (c) the budget allocated and utilized for public health awareness, early screening, and routine diagnostics at the primary level during this period; and
- (d) whether Government plans to revamp the National Programme for Prevention and Control of Non-Communicable Diseases (NP-NCD) to mandate universal periodic screening at primary health centers?

**ANSWER

(a) As per the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) report “India: Health of the Nation’s States” published in 2017, the proportion of death due to Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) is 61.8 % of total deaths in India. Out of this, 28.1 % were due to cardiovascular diseases, 8.3% were due to Cancer, 10.9% due to Chronic Respiratory Disease and 6.5% due to Diabetes, Urogenital, Blood and Endocrine diseases.

(b) to (d) The Department of Health and Family Welfare provides technical and financial support to States and Union Territories across the country under the National Programme for Prevention and Control of Non Communicable Diseases (NP-NCD) as part of the National Health Mission (NHM). The programme focuses on strengthening infrastructure, human resource development, screening, early diagnosis, referral, treatment, and health promotion for Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) Under NP-NCD, 770 District NCD Clinics, 233 Cardiac Care Units and 6,410

NCD clinics at Community Health Centres have been set up across the country. In addition, 524 Day Care Cancer Centres (DCCCs) are functional across the country to ensure cancer care accessibility at district hospital level.

Under NP-NCD, funds are released to States/UTs under the National Health Mission based on their Programme Implementation Plans (PIPs) for strengthening prevention, screening, diagnosis and management of non-communicable diseases, including cancer. State/UT wise details of State Programme Implementation Plan (SPIP) Approvals for National Programme-Non Communicable Diseases (NP-NCD) under NHM during the period of F.Y. 2023-24 to 2025-26 is attached at Annexure-I.

A population-based initiative for prevention, control and screening for common NCDs including three common cancers (oral cancer, breast cancer and cervical cancer) has been rolled out in the country under NHM. In this initiative, persons more than 30 years of age are targeted for their screening at Ayushman Arogya Mandir. Prevention, control & screening services are being provided through trained frontline workers.
