STATUS ON UDYAM PORTAL AND RAMP SCHEME

111. SHRI SANJAY KUMAR JHA:

Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether registration on the Udyam Portal has increased during the last five years and if so, the figures thereof from the year 2020 till date;
- (b) the performance of various sectors under the RAMP (Raising and Accelerating MSME Performance) Scheme; and
- (c) the steps taken to promote digitalisation, export competitiveness and rural industrial clusters in the MSME sector in line with the goal of Viksit Bharat@2047?

(a): The MSMEs registered on Udyam Registration Portal (URP) and Udyam Assist Portal (UAP) with effect from 01.07.2020 till 30.06.2026, are as below:

The Udyam Registration is increasing on year to year basis.

(b): The “Raising and Accelerating MSME Performance” (RAMP) Programme is a sector- agnostic programme and MSMEs from all the sectors are eligible to benefit from various initiatives being undertaken under the RAMP Programme. There are 5 broad areas of interventions, as follows:

- (i) Under Centre–State Collaboration all the 36 States/ UTs are participating in the RAMP Programme and are supported for preparing a Strategic Investment Plan (SIP) for development of MSME sector in respective States and UTs. The SIPs from all 36 States / UTs have been received, evaluated and part funding amounting to Rs 3031.754 cr approved by the Ministry. The States / UTs are at different stages of implementing the approved projects.

- (ii) MSE Green Investments and Financing for Transformation (MSE-GIFT), the Outlay of ₹478 crore for duration of 4 years from 2023-24 to 2026-27; where in 6,397 MSEs benefitted (as on 30.06.2026).
 - (iii) MSE Scheme for Promotion of Investment in Circular Economy (MSE-SPICE), the Outlay of ₹472.50 crore for duration of 4 years from 2023-24 to 2026-27; where in 30 MSEs benefitted (as on 30.06.2026).
 - (iv) MSME Trade Enablement and Marketing (TEAM) Initiative, the Outlay of ₹277.35 crore for duration of 3 years from 2024-25 to 2026-27; where in 75,911 MSMEs registered on the TEAM Portal (as on 30.06.2026).
 - (v) MSE Online Dispute Resolution (ODR) Scheme for Delayed Payments, the Outlay of ₹189.00 crore for duration of 3 years from 2024-25 to 2026-27; where in 26,997 cases registered on the ODR Portal (as on 14.07.2026).
- (c): The Government has undertaken various initiatives to promote digitalisation, export competitiveness and rural industrial clusters in the MSME sector in line with the vision of Viksit Bharat@2047. These include:
- Formalisation of Informal Micro Enterprises through the Udyam Assist Platform (UAP), integration of the Udyam Registration Portal with the National Career Service (NCS) Portal, e-Shram Portal and Skill India Digital Portal, grievance redressal through the CHAMPIONS Portal, promotion of digital transactions under the PM Vishwakarma Scheme, entrepreneurship development through the Entrepreneurship Skill Development Programme (ESDP), and technology support through 18 Technology Centres.
 - To promote exports, the Ministry has established 65 Export Facilitation Centres (EFCs) across the country to provide mentoring and handholding support to MSMEs through dissemination of information on export-related schemes.
 - The Ministry of MSME implements Micro and Small Enterprises Cluster Development Programme (MSE-CDP) across the country. Under the scheme, financial assistance is being extended to establish Common Facility Centers (CFCs) in the existing clusters and establish/up-grade infrastructural facilities in new/existing industrial estates/areas/flatted factory complexes. MSE-CDP is a demand driven scheme and proposals have to be submitted by the State Government/UTs.
