IMPLEMENTATION AND IMPACT ASSESSMENT OF PMDDKY

1441. SHRI TERASH GOWALLA:

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government has undertaken any outcome-based assessment of the Pradhan Mantri Dhan-Dhanya Krishi Yojana (PMDDKY) since its launch, indicating its objectives and the measurable improvements in agricultural productivity and farmers' income;
- (b) the budget allocation, funds released and expenditure under the Scheme, year-wise;
- (c) the number of beneficiaries, including the category of benefits provided, State-wise; and
- (d) whether Assam has been covered under the Scheme, if so, the district-wise number of beneficiaries, assistance provided, impact on farm productivity and income and the steps taken to expand the Scheme in the State?

ANSWER

(a) to (d): The Union Cabinet approved Prime Minister Dhan Dhaanya Krishi Yojana (DDKY) on 16th July, 2025 to cover 100 districts and the scheme was formally launched on 11th October, 2025. Since DDKY is in 1st year of implementation, it is too early for outcome-based assessment. However, to track progress of the scheme in each district including in Assam, the scheme Dashboard captures Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) on monthly basis. Progress of DDKY Districts on all Indicators is available on the Dashboard (<https://pmddky.niti.gov.in/>).

The scheme is being implemented in 100 districts through convergence of 36 existing schemes across 11 Ministries/Departments, other state schemes and private partnership.

There is no proposal under consideration to expand the scheme to other districts in Assam. However, if the state identifies additional districts that require similar focused attention, the state may adopt and replicate the same framework and approach from their own resources and administrative mechanisms.
