Will the Minister of **Commerce and Industry** be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the progress made towards reducing logistics costs as a percentage of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) under the National Logistics Policy;
- (b) the number, progress and status of infrastructure projects that have been mapped and integrated on the PM Gati Shakti portal so far in the country, including Gujarat; and
- (c) the number, progress and status of projects under the PM Gati Shakti framework that have recorded cost overruns since the launch of the PAIMANA portal in July, 2025, the value thereof along with the details, Ministry-wise?

ANSWER

**THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE & INDUSTRY
(SHRI JITIN PRASADA)**

- (a):** National Logistics Policy (NLP) was launched in September 2022 by the Government of India to develop a technologically enabled, integrated, cost efficient, resilient, sustainable and trusted logistics ecosystem in the country for accelerated and inclusive growth. One of the objectives of NLP is to reduce the cost of logistics in India so as to enable the country to compete with global benchmarks. As per the latest assessment of logistics cost conducted by DPIIT in association with National Council of Applied Economic Research (NCAER), the logistics cost in India is estimated at about 7.97% of GDP, which is comparable to the advanced economies.
- (b) & (c):** PM GatiShakti National Master Plan (PMGS-NMP), a transformative approach for planning and development of infrastructure in the country, was launched in October 2021. The Network Planning Group (NPG), constituted under the PMGS-NMP framework, evaluates the critical infrastructure projects of the central Government to

ensure integrated planning, multimodality, inter-modality, synchronization of efforts, last mile connectivity, comprehensive development in and around the project location, data driven decision makings, etc at the planning stage. Till June 2026, 396 infrastructure projects (including 27 projects of Gujarat) with total estimated cost of about ₹18.66 Lakh Crore have been evaluated through the NPG mechanism. Out of these, 256 projects have been sanctioned, of which, 198 projects are under implementation. Ministry-wise details of these 396 projects are given at **Annexure-A**.

The monitoring of ongoing Central Sector Projects costing ₹150 Crore and above is monitored by Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI), based on the information provided by the project implementing agencies, on PAIMANA portal of MoSPI. The project-wise details of all ongoing infrastructure projects are available on the website <https://paimana-proj.mospi.gov.in/ReportPage>. The progress/ status of projects under PM GatiShakti is not separately maintained on PAIMANA portal.
