MINERAL-BASED INDUSTRIES AND EXPORT PROMOTION IN JHARKHAND

1490. SMT. MAHUA MAJI:

Will the Minister of **Commerce and Industry** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government has assessed the progress of the development of mineral-based industries, industrial corridors and export-oriented manufacturing units in Jharkhand;
- (b) if so, the details of the industrial projects sanctioned, investment proposals and central assistance provided for export promotion in Jharkhand during the last five years; and
- (c) whether Government is considering to implement any special policy or incentive package for the development of value-addition-based industries and export-oriented industrial clusters in Jharkhand?

ANSWER

- (a) & (b):** Government of India has granted a letter of permission to Export Oriented Unit (EOU), namely M/s CR Advanced Materials Private Limited at Manjhiladih, Gadi Srirampur, Giridih (Jharkhand) for manufacturing and export of Silico Manganese, Anthracite Coal (Crushed/Sized), Ferro Manganese, Ferro Silicon. The proposed investment in the unit (land, building, plant & machinery) is Rs. 257.72 (Crore) with proposed export of Rs. 2826.37 Crores in 05 years. Further, a total of 11 major mineral blocks have been auctioned in the state of Jharkhand since the introduction of the auction regime in 2015. Of these, 3 blocks are currently active.
- (c):** Government of India is implementing the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme for Specialty Steel with an outlay of ₹6,322 crore for five years from 2023-24 to 2027-28. The State had 102 steel units with a cumulative installed capacity of 85.12 million tonnes in 2021-22. By 2025-26, the number of units had increased to 123, while the cumulative installed capacity had risen to 100.32 million tonnes over the last five years.
