Growing demand for Urea in Telangana

189 Shri Vem Narendar Reddy:

Will the Minister of **Chemicals and Fertilizers** be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government has any policy to accord priority to the allocation of Urea produced by Ramagundam Fertilizers and Chemicals Limited (RFCL), Telangana, for meeting the requirements of Telangana before allocating it to other States, if so, the details thereof, and

(b) whether Government proposes to enhance the production capacity of RFCL to meet the growing demand for Urea in Telangana, if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

(a) & (b) Urea produced by Ramagundam Fertilizers and Chemicals Limited (RFCL), Telangana, like that from all other indigenous Urea manufacturing plants, is pooled at the national level and allocated to States based on their assessed requirements to ensure equitable distribution and uninterrupted availability across the country. Allocating the production of a single plant predominantly to one State may adversely affect the supply position in the event of unforeseen contingencies such as plant shutdowns, maintenance, seasonal demand fluctuations and logistics-related disruptions. Moreover, the Department remains committed to ensuring that the fertilizer requirement of Telangana continues to be met through an appropriate mix of indigenous production, including supplies from RFCL, and imported Urea, while minimizing any supply disruptions.

Further, before the commencement of each cropping season, Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare (DA&FW), in consultation with all the State Governments, assesses the requirement of fertilizers. On the basis of month-wise & State-wise projections given by DA&FW, Department of Fertilizers allocates adequate quantities and ensures the supply of fertilizers to the States by issuing monthly supply plan.

In view of the above, the availability of Urea in the State of Telangana has remained adequate during the ongoing Kharif 2026 season. During the period 01.04.2026 to 15.07.2026, 7,28,000 Metric tons of Urea was made available in the State against the pro-rata requirement of 6,73,000 Metric tons with leaving a closing stock of 3,76,000 Metric tons on 15.07.2026 in the State.
