**STATUS OF DEVELOPMENT OF INDUSTRIAL CORRIDOR AND INDUSTRIAL
AREA IN MAHARASHTRA**

2281. DR. JYOTI NAGNATH WAGHMARE:

Will the Minister of **Commerce and Industry** be pleased to state:

- (a) the present physical status of the development of the Delhi–Mumbai Industrial Corridor (DMIC) and the Shendra–Bidkin Industrial Area in Maharashtra;
- (b) the budgetary provisions made for the development of cold chain infrastructure and cargo hubs for the export of fruits from Nashik, Jalgaon and Nagpur;
- (c) the details of the Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) received by Maharashtra during the last three years, sector-wise; and
- (d) the policy initiatives taken to integrate the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) of the State with the global supply chain?

ANSWER

**THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE & INDUSTRY
(SHRI JITIN PRASADA)**

- (a):** Under the National Industrial Corridor Development Programme (NICDP) of Government of India, eight projects have been approved under Delhi-Mumbai Industrial Corridor (DMIC), details of which are placed at **Annexure I**.

Shendra-Bidkin Industrial Area (SBIA) has been developed in Chhatrapati Sambhaji Nagar district of Maharashtra to provide world class, sustainable and resilient plug-n-play infrastructure with walk-to-work concept for industries. Trunk Infrastructure and associated facilities have been completed in Shendra Industrial Area and Phase A of Bidkin Industrial area. A total of 340 plots admeasuring 3,462 acres have been allotted at Shendra-Bidkin Industrial Area, Maharashtra.

- (b):** As reported by Ministry of Road Transport and Highways, Government of India (GoI) has awarded the project for development of a Multi Modal Logistics Park (MMLP) on about 150 acres of land of Sindi Dry Port of Jawaharlal Nehru Port Authority (JNPA) near Nagpur on Operation & Maintenance Model (PPP mode) for which Letter of Acceptance has been issued. The cold chain infrastructure and cargo hubs are included in the permissible facilities list and in the Concept Master Plan of the MMLP.

Ministry of Food Processing Industries (MoFPI) has reported that the following projects have been completed under the Cold Chain Scheme at Nashik and Nagpur:

Further, MoFPI has reported Integrated Cold Chain & Value Addition Infrastructure scheme under the Pradhan Mantri Kisan SAMPADA Yojana (PMKSY), wherein any individual/ Central & State PSU/ Joint Venture/ NGO/ Cooperative Self Help Group (SHG)/ Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs)/ Farmer Producer Company (FPC)/ Public & Private Sector Companies/ Limited Liability Partnership (LLP)/ Partnership Firm/ Proprietorship Firm etc. can apply against the Expression of Interest and avail the benefits of the scheme.

As reported by Ministry of Civil Aviation, facilities for air cargo movement are available at Nashik, Jalgaon, Nagpur, Pune, Aurangabad, Kolhapur, Mumbai, Shirdi and Navi Mumbai airports in the state of Maharashtra.

The Government of Maharashtra has reported that under the Maharashtra State Export Policy 2023, dedicated budgetary financial assistance is provided through two key infrastructure windows, namely:

Export- Oriented Specific Projects (EOSP)	Grants up to 50 Crore per project for sector-specific export initiatives, including post-harvest treatment, pack houses, cold storage chains, and irradiation facilities in key agricultural belts.
Export- Oriented Industrial Parks (EOIP)	Financial support up to 100 Crore per park for establishing specialized export parks, plug-and-play facilities, and cold Storages.

- (c): The sector-wise details of FDI equity inflow reported in the State of Maharashtra during the last three financial years (i.e, from April, 2023 to March, 2026) are attached at **Annexure-II**.
- (d): As reported by the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, Government of India has established 65 Export Facilitation Centers (EFCs) in its field offices across the country with the aim of providing mentoring and handholding support to MSMEs in exporting their products and services.

The Department of Commerce has reported that Central Government through its scheme namely Trade Infrastructure for Export Scheme (TIES) assists Central and State Government agencies in the creation of appropriate export infrastructure for growth of exports. Under the Scheme, 01 project has been completed in Maharashtra. The details are as below:

1. Financial Support & Subsidies for MSME Exporters	Interest Subsidy	5% interest subsidy on term loans for MSMEs engaged in export manufacturing.
	Logistics & Freight Support	Logistics subsidies for first-time MSME exporters and freight charge reimbursements.
	Risk Mitigation	100% reimbursement of ECGC premium for the initial export shipments of micro and small units to encourage international trade entry
	Export Performance Incentives	Financial rewards (1%-3% subsidy) based on incremental export performance year-on-year.
	Quality, Compliance, and Certification Assistance	Financial support/reimbursement for obtaining international certifications, quality benchmarks, GI tagging, and testing/inspection fees.
2. Cluster Development & ODOP Integration	Export Infrastructure Support	Development of 30 World-Standard Export-Oriented Industrial Parks (EOIP) and plug-and-play manufacturing units with CETP, quality labs, and common utility support specially designed for MSMEs.
