PERFORMANCE OF PRODUCTION LINKED INCENTIVE SCHEMES

Will the Minister of **Commerce and Industry** be pleased to state:

- (a) the current status of implementation of Production Linked Incentive (PLI) schemes applicable across various sectors;
- (b) the details of investment received, production achieved and employment generated so far under these schemes;
- (c) the details of the performance and top-performing sectors under the PLI framework, sector-wise;
- (d) whether any mid-term amendments or extension of duration have been made in these schemes, if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) the details of the steps taken by Government to boost manufacturing, exports and the Aatmanirbhar Bharat initiative through these schemes?

- (a) & (b):** The Government has approved 14 Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Schemes across key manufacturing sectors with a total approved outlay of ₹1.91 lakh crore to strengthen domestic manufacturing, attract investments, enhance exports, generate employment and promote India's integration with global value chains. The schemes are being implemented by the respective nodal Ministries/Departments. As on 31.03.2026, 892 applications have been approved under the PLI Schemes across various sectors. Manufacturing has commenced under the majority of the approved schemes, while implementation is progressing in the remaining sectors in accordance with their approved timelines.

The PLI schemes have recorded significant cumulative achievements across the country. As on 31.03.2026, the cumulative achievements under the PLI schemes are as follows:

(c): The sectoral impact of the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) schemes across various sectors is as under:

- In the Large Scale Electronics Manufacturing sector, mobile phone production has increased by around 2.4 times since the launch of the Scheme. Mobile phone imports have declined by about 77%, and around 99.2% of mobile phones used in India are now manufactured domestically.
- The Pharmaceuticals sector has recorded cumulative sales of over ₹3.64 lakh crore under the Scheme. It has also enabled the domestic manufacture of 1,931 pharmaceutical products, including 191 bulk drugs manufactured in India for the first time, thereby strengthening domestic manufacturing capabilities.
- In the Bulk Drugs sector, manufacturing capacity of about 55,000 MT has been established across 26 critical Active Pharmaceutical Ingredients (APIs), significantly enhancing domestic production capacity and reducing import dependence for products such as Paracetamol, Levofloxacin and Norfloxacin.
- The PLI scheme for Manufacturing of Medical Devices has facilitated domestic manufacturing of advanced medical equipment such as CT Scanners, MRI Systems, Cath Labs and Ultrasonography equipment. 22 applicants have commenced operations and 55 unique medical devices have been commissioned.
- In the Telecom & Networking Products sector, the Scheme has supported the development of indigenous 4G technology and domestic manufacturing capability for 5G telecom equipment, strengthening India's telecom manufacturing ecosystem.
- The PLI scheme for White Goods has contributed to a significant expansion in domestic manufacturing. Compressor manufacturing capacity has increased from 1 million units in 2021 to 10 million units in 2025-26, while localisation of key components such as PCBAs and Cross Flow Fans has improved substantially, leading to domestic manufacturing of several critical air-conditioner components.

(d): The Government continuously reviews the implementation of the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) schemes in consultation with the respective implementing Ministries/Departments and industry stakeholders. Based on implementation experience and sector-specific requirements, suitable modifications have been made within the approved framework of certain PLI schemes to facilitate effective implementation on the approval of Empowered Group of Secretaries (EGoS).

(e): The PLI Schemes constitute a key pillar of the Make in India and Aatmanirbhar Bharat initiatives. The schemes incentivize domestic manufacturing, encourage

investment, promote exports, generate employment, and enhance domestic value addition across strategic sectors.

In addition, the Government has undertaken complementary initiatives such as PM GatiShakti National Master Plan, National Logistics Policy, Ease of Doing Business reforms, Districts as Export Hubs, Startup India, and measures to strengthen domestic manufacturing ecosystems and supply chains. These initiatives, together with the PLI schemes, have improved India's manufacturing competitiveness, reduced import dependence in several strategic sectors, and strengthened India's position in global value chains.
