JAL JEEVAN MISSION

2466. SHRI G. C. CHANDRASHEKHAR:

Will the Minister of Jal Shakti be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of rural households provided Functional Household Tap Connections (FHTC) from August 2019 to June 2026;
- (b) the Budget Estimates, Revised Estimates and Actual Expenditure under Jal Jeevan Mission during FY 2023-24 to FY 2025-26;
- (c) the number of rural households provided FHTC during the said period; and
- (d) the reasons for the gap between financial expenditure and physical achievement, if any?

ANSWER

(a) to (d) Drinking Water being a state subject, it is the states, who plan, design, approve and implement drinking water supply schemes. Government of India supplements the efforts of the states by providing technical and financial assistance.

Towards this end and to make provision of tap water supply to every rural household across the country, Government of India, in partnership with states, has been implementing Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM), since August 2019.

The estimated outlay of the mission (2019-24) was of Rs. 3.60 lakh crore, out of which central share was Rs. 2.08 lakh crore. Almost entire central share approved by the Cabinet was released to the eligible States till March 2025.

Subsequently, in March 2026, the Government approved the extension of Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) period up to December 2028 with enhanced outlay and restructured implementation focusing on structural reforms in rural drinking water supply sector under JJM 2.0.

The total financial outlay of the Mission has now been enhanced from Rs. 3.60 lakh crore to Rs. 8.69 lakh crore with the central share increasing from Rs. 2.08 lakh crore to Rs. 3.59 lakh

crore i.e. additional central outlay of Rs. 1.51 lakh Crore. The year-wise details of financial progress made so far under the Mission is as under:

At the time of announcement of JJM, around 3.23 crore (17%) rural households were reported to have tap water connections in the country. So far, as reported by States/UTs as on 18.07.2026, around 12.65 crore additional rural households have been provided with tap water connections. Thus, as on 18.07.2026, out of 19.36 crore rural households in the country, around 15.89 crore (82%) households are reported to have tap water supply in their homes.
